Museum News-Pat Hillyard



In preparation for the Caravan the Museum is preparing a special exhibit to celebrate its Anniversary. It will include a variety of special Corvettes and archival items from the NCM Grand Opening and original items from the first Corvette Caravan. There is more information and a video available on the Museum website.

It may be a little known fact that it was a Ford Thunderbird that Inspired GM to put a V-8 in their sporty Corvette. Sales of the 1953 and 1954 Corvette had missed their mark and they knew something had to be done to improve them or the new American Sports Car could fold. Thanks to a donor, Don Hering, the Museum now has a

1955 Thunderbird to help tell that story.

The number of vehicles housed within the collections of the Museum continues to grow thanks to the generosity of their numerous donors. The cars are used in a variety of ways, including sales to help raise money for the Museum. There is a 1974 Corvette that was donated in 2014 and has been exhibited several times at the Museum. It was a one-owner car at the time of its donation and currently has 34,434 miles on it. It will be up for auction on ebay. For more information check out the Museum website and the ebay website.

Each fall the NCM partners with the Kentucky State Police for a series of back-to-back road trips, taking participants through the countryside. Change to the By-Laws

If you have been to any meetings this year or read the President's Blog then you know that our current President, Frank Paolo, has decided not to serve another term. Therefore, we need candidates that might be interested in taking on the Presidential duties to step forward. In order to open the field to the entire club, it will be necessary to make a small change to the Club's By-Laws.

The section of the By-Laws pertaining to the election of a President as currently written are as follows:

Section 7.5 To be considered for the position of President, the person must have served on the Board of Directors for the full fiscal year immediately prior to the election.

The proposed change would eliminate this requirement so that any club member in good standing (meaning that their dues are current) would be able to run for the office of President.

This revised section would then read as follows:

Section 7.5 To be considered for the position of President, the interested party must be a member in good standing (meaning that their dues are current).

This change to the By-Laws will be open for discussion at the September Membership meeting and voted on at the October meeting.

Road Trip



Pat Hillyard has planned a trip for the Club to take place September 15th to the 18th or 19th, 2019. It is mainly a driving trip that will cover some routes with great Corvette roads.

The trip will start out from Uniontown Mall in Pennsylvania and travel through Elkins, West Virginia to Harrisonville, Virginia , and from there get on the Blue Ridge Parkway. There will be a stop for dinner at the Liberty Station Restaurant in Bedford, Virginia, and we will spend that first night in Roanoke, Virginia. The next morning the drive will continue on the Blue Ridge Parkway and then on to Asheville, North Carolina, spending the

second night there. The next morning there will be a tour of the Biltmore Estate and then head on to Blairsville, Georgia and dinner will be at a motorcycle/sports car resort and spend the night in that area. The next morning will start with a drive on the Gauntlet, a loop of 133 miles of twisty roads through the mountains of northeast Georgia. 
